«MUSIQUES EN SCÈNE» MUSIC BIENNIAL March 1st to 27th

The latest of Lyon's Biennial festivals is dedicated to contemporary music. Refined, bold and funny, it appeals to the general public through its concerts and exhibitions. There will also be a workshop at the auditorium for budding composers armed with their smartphone, and a flash mob set to a legendary work by Steve Reich. The festival aims to introduce contemporary music to a wider audience and present a diverse lineup of international talent. The 2016 edition will feature artists from 15 countries, headlined by Dutch composer Michel Van der Aa, Czech composer Ondrej Adamek and Ryoji Ikeda.

BIENALE MUSIQUES EN SCÈNE LYON 1 ER - 27 MARS 2016

THE LYON NATIONAL OPERA FESTIVAL FOR HUMANITY MARCH 15TH TO APRIL 3RD

Directed by Serge Dorny, the Lyon Opera House, a historic building renovated and decked out in black metal by French architect Jean Nouvel, shines far beyond the city. This mid-season festival thrusts the Opera House into the spotlight with a focus on humanity. Four works will be performed, including Benjamin, dernière nuit by Michel Tabachnik, based on a libretto by Régis Debray. Also on the bill are La juive by Jacques Fromental Halévy, directed by Olivier Py, and Brundibar, an opera for children.

MUSÉE DES CONFLUENCES : NEW EXHIBITIONS!

Already one year and more than a million visitors! Lyon's new cultural gateway, the emblematic Confluences Museum, will be offering a program over the next seven months that is sure to be a feast for the senses. Two major exhibitions are slated: Antartica, starting April 26th, and A vos pieds starting September 13th. Antartica is an entirely digital show dedicated to the biodiversity of the Antarctic. It is based on footage from the expedition of Luc Jacquet, director of March of the Penguins. Corps Rebelles, a part of the Biennial Dance Festival, invites visitors to better understand modern dance. Faithful to its groundbreaking spirit, the Museum explores a broad array of themes through an interdisciplinary approach backed by scientific research.


